



Companies, which supply chemical products for professional use, must provide their clients with safety data sheets. The safety data sheets must be prepared according to national rules and in the official language of the country or countries in which the chemical products are marketed.

### **CLP, REACH and extended safety data sheets**

During the transition period before the CLP regulation becomes effective, the requirements for information on classifications and labelling are altered. This means that safety data sheets must be updated for both pure substances and for chemicals products.



If exposure scenarios are available for one or more substances contained in a chemical product, an extended safety data sheet must be prepared. The extended safety data sheet must include information from the exposure scenarios.

### **Danger labelling**

Most chemicals must be supplied with a danger label in conformity with national regulation and in the national language.



### **Product registration**

Product registration of chemical products is a requirement in many countries. The national rules and regulation vary considerably and must not be confused with the requirements under REACH.
